










I can tell you that the road will not be easy, but with work and effective management of our resources, the results will be seen.



On July 1, 1987, five small school districts in southern Nevada County consolidated to establish the Nevada School District. The district is located in a safe, rural area in the small community of Rosston, AR. NSD serves students in grades K-12 on one campus.

NSD's mission is to provide a safe school climate in which all students are permitted to reach their highest educational goals. Educators are committed to creating a supportive and academically challenging learning environment that helps students see their potential for success. Educators attend rigorous and innovative training programs to ensure the most effective instructional practices.

The district provides a variety of educational opportunities. A Career Action Planning Program is in place for students in grades 7-12 to help students and their parents explore educational and occupational possibilities and make appropriate career decisions based on a solid base of information. Educators work with all students and their parents in developing and maintaining individualized student success plans. Students are offered a variety of electives including business courses, agricultural courses, and coding classes. Students are given the opportunity to enroll in advanced placement courses and/or concurrent credit courses through Virtual Arkansas or at the local community college to begin preparing for postsecondary education while earning high school and college credit. Students also have the opportunity to enroll in one of four areas of study at UAHT's Secondary Career & Technical Education Center. The Secondary Career Center provides students with handson experiences in a variety of career fields.

The district also offers a variety of extracurricular activities for those students maintaining the required GPA. Students in grades 7-12 may participate in basketball, track, volleyball, trap shooting, cheerleading, and band, as well as a host of school based clubs. Students have the opportunity to serve the community while obtaining community service hours and a community service learning credit through the district's award winning FBLA program and through the National Honor Society. Students in grades 9-12 can participate in golf, baseball, and softball.

Nevada School District offers a Pre-K program to ensure that our students are ready for school.

Nevada School District offers a student/ teacher ratio of 11:1, allowing significantly more one on one instructional time for students. Students and educators have access to the latest technology to support our students' college and career readiness including one virtual lab and Chromebooks or IPads and Promethean Boards in every classroom.

Prescott School District is the home of the Curley Wolves. A public school district rich in tradition educating approximately 1,000 students ages PreK-12. The district is comprised of four levels of learning including Prescott School District PreK (ages 3-4), Prescott Elementary School (K-4), Prescott Jr High School (5-8), and Prescott High School (9-12).

Prescott School District is a district wide Professional Learning Communities (PLC) school in the state of Arkansas that is part of the Arkansas Department of Education and Solution Tree pilot program. It is the fundamental purpose of the district to ensure high levels of learning for ALL students. This mission is achieved by collaborative teams working together to ensure that every Prescott graduate possesses the essential skills, behaviors and mindset to lead a healthy, hopeful, positive

and productive life.

Prescott School District offers programs to ensure a well rounded student. Classes and programs are readily available to students. Prescott High School boasts first class Computer Science classes with the highest enrollment in Southwest Arkansas. A newly designed agriculture program involving donated livestock is being offered to students as well as an industrial arts program. Students may earn various degrees by taking college credit courses. A L3 Driving Simulator program is being introduced to allow students to obtain a driver's license and to train for CDL's.

The Prescott Jr High School building offers top notch security for students as well housing state of the art cafeteria for jr high and high school students. Career planning begins at the jr high level for all students.

A new state of the art elementary school boasting bullet proof windows in all classrooms offers a safe learning environment. Character education programs are being used at Prescott Elementary School. Kindness, respect, fairness, and trustworthiness are essential qualities of successful learners and effective schools.

Prescott School District Prek is an oncampus preschool program designed to prepare children for kindergarten offering a variety of learning skills as well as social skills. The program has expanded to include four classrooms.



County Seat of Nevada County

Prescott is strategically located between Memphis and Dallas along Interstate 30 in a predominately rural area of Southwest Arkansas. Prescott is a community of 3296. Prescott offers a mild, four season climate. The average high is 77 degrees, with an average low of 54 degrees. Over the course of a year, Prescott typically receives 55.37 inches of precipitation.

The rural nature of the community brings many quality of life advantages to families. The school district is smaller allowing for more hands-on time with children. The low crime rate in the community is attractive to many who want to raise their families without the fear often associated with living in a larger community. Several neighborhoods have adopted crime watch areas. The sense of community and the ability to be involved in all aspects of the community's life are appealing to many people.

Even though Prescott and Nevada County are rural, we are a short drive from many larger communities. Just 45 miles from Texarkana, which has many shopping, dining and entertainment options.

The attractions offered at Hot Springs, a popular convention and vacation area, are only an hour and five minutes away. Little Rock is located 90 miles up Interstate 30 and host a wide range of social activities including theatre, dinner theatre, concerts and sporting events.

For those who like a more natural form of recreation the area boast five state parks within a 45 mile radius of Prescott. Hunting,

fishing and boating opportunities abound in the area. Many people travel from other countries and states to enjoy the camping and fishing opportunities found at White Oak Lake State Park located in Nevada County.

Prescott has all the convenient services of a large community. From internet accessibility to pet grooming to automotive repair and restoration. Services are provided by local merchants who quickly know your name and preferences. Likewise, the community is continually striving to improve the quality of life in the area. The City of Prescott and Nevada County have a new \$1,000,000 library and recent efforts have resulted in the restoration of the old Missouri Pacific Railroad Depot (which houses the Nevada County Museum) and the refurbishment of all the sidewalks downtown.

Prescott is home to three primary care clinics that serve the population of 3,296. Each of the primary care clinics also have specialist who come into their clinics on periodic basis. Our Pafford Medical Services offers a quick response time for local residents and businesses. The community is served by Wadley Regional Medical Center of Hope. The transport time by ambulance is 13 minutes.

Prescott has regional access to a large number of educational institutions. The University of Arkansas Community College at Hope (15 miles) provides many job training activities for area businesses, including courses for Holcim (Formally Firestone Building Products) located in Prescott. Cossatot Technical College Extension Center in Nashville (35 miles) offers customized training opportunities for area industries on a regular basis. SAU Tech is a technical twoyear college that is located in East Camden (50 miles) and specializes in training for defense and aerospace industries. Three four-year universities are located within 30 miles of Prescott. Henderson State University and Ouachita Baptist University offer a wide range of four-year degree programs and are located in Arkadelphia (30 miles by I-30). Southern Arkansas University is located in Magnolia (30 miles) and offers several liberal arts programs as well as industry specific classes. Just a little further away in Texarkana (45 miles via I-30) is Texarkana College, which has a number of technical classes offered as part of the standard curriculum and Texas A&M University-Texarkana offers our leaders of tomorrow with a high quality, rewarding and affordable education experience.

Prescott's employers draw workers from a 12 County population base of 227,143. The community's central location and access to post-secondary education and training options add to the availability of the area's workforce. The labor shed offers diverse skills sets and employment opportunities, with the largest sector being manufacturing. Approximately 22 percent of the region's workforce is employed in manufacturing, with services and retail also well represented. The Prescott workforce is prepared and eager to meet its existing and future employers' labor needs.

THE NEVADA COUNTY LIBRARY



The NEW Prescott/Nevada County Library and Educational Facility was completed in June 2003 under the leadership of Mayor Howard Taylor and County Judge James Roy Brown. Jerry Hollensworth of Trull-Hollensworth in Magnolia, Arkansas, was the architect and Doyle Howard of Doyle Howard Construction, Inc. in Delight, Arkansas was the contractor.

A one million-dollar grant was secured in 1999, by then State Senator Mike Ross, for construction of a new facility. Other legislators aiding in this endeavor included State Representatives Sandra Rodgers and Tommy Roebuck and State Senator Percy Malone.

Mrs. Jane Bemis issued a \$75,000 challenge for furnishing the new facility. Mrs. Bemis would match up to \$75,000 for this endeavor. The citizens of Nevada County, the state of Arkansas and the United States responded to the challenge by raising the additional \$75,000. Ms. Jayne Randolph, Prescott Elementary School Media Specialist, served as planner and coordinator of furnishings, along with Mrs. Bemis, Mrs. Gibson, and Friends of the Library.

Libraries are of great value to their communities and our library is no exception. We provide access to the internet, genealogy research tools, books, audio books, magazines and newspapers. Online at home services such e-books, access to the card catalog and the Traveler Database are available as well.

The summer reading programs are

full of great books, in depth information on the theme, and special guests and performances. The library also served as a distribution location for the Arkansas No Kid Hungry feeding program this summer.

The library has a spacious meeting room that is well used by local community groups and businesses. GED classes, senior fitness classes, financial planning, job counseling, and kids cooking and coding classes were all hosted by the library this year.

Our children's area is becoming a comfortable and fun place for children to read and learn as well as a place to discover the world of technology with tablets that children play games on and download books to read, while sitting comfortably in fun furniture. Librarian Theresa Tyree has recently received a grant for \$1,000.00 to enhance children's literacy in the library.

The services and programs at the library are still free to the public. While this is the case, the library must always search out new funding when major purchases are needed or just to keep technology in the library up to date. Most of our computers were put into service in 2010. Our server predates the public computers. Technology is constantly changing and to provide good service to our users, we must begin to update equipment and software. This will be our focus in the coming year.

The Nevada County Library was first located in an old school building (gym)

where the current Daniel's Trailer Park is located (West Elm/West Second/West Third)

Other locations have been on East Second, across from the courthouse, 123 West Main, and the last move to the corner of West Second South and West Elm. The new library is currently located at 121 West Main in downtown Prescott.

PRESCOTT COUNTRY CLUB

Built in 1969 and designed by architect Al Rayford, the Prescott Country Club is located an easy two miles from downtown Prescott at 1667 US Highway 67 North. The Prescott Country Club features a nine-par, 36 length, 3182 yard golf course as well as driving range for practice. With the region's moderate weather year around, the course is open 12 months, and it is the host venue for the Prescott High School golfing team as well as several regional and local golf tournaments and scrambles annually.

The facility also features a clubhouse with a dining area, and a swimming pool, which traditionally opens at the start of May. Each year the Country Club is also the location for the Nevada County Cancer Association Tournament and the Business and Industry Appreciation Dinner and Golf Tournament. The County Club also has a Men and Women's Golf Association that sponsors many golf tournaments and scrambles throughout the year.

PRESCOTT RACEWAY

Prescott Raceway is located at 5121 Highway 53 E. Prescott, Arkansas. The Racetrack is owned and operated by Jackie and Velvet Lewis.

Prescott Raceway is a 1/8th mile track that was built in 1975 and bought by Mr. & Mrs. Lewis in 2010. Races are held about 36 weeks out of the year weather permitting. Racers come from all over the United Stated such as Minnesota, Missouri, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Texas and of course out great racers of Arkansas. The track offers a concession stand, Super pro, No Box. Jr Dragsters. Index, Sportsman, and beginners' races. Information can be found at prescottraceway.net or Facebook.

WHITE OAK LAKE STATE PARK

White Oak Lake State Park is an official Arkansas State Park, located two miles from Bluff City, 21 miles from Prescott and 22 miles from Rosston, at the Nevada County and Ouachita County line. The state park has camping and RV facilities as well as boat and bike rentals, playground facilities and swimming areas.

White Oak Lake is the second largest lake created by the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission, spanning approximately 1,656 acres. Created in 1961, the reservoir resides among rich woodlands and miles of pine trees. The lake itself has many submerged and doormat trees, and for outdoor enthusiasts and fishermen, the lake is known to have an abundance of bass, crappie, bream, and catfish.

Outside the lake, the state park also features several hiking trails, with deer and other wildlife sightings common. For bird watchers, the part is also known as a haven for American bald eagles.

With its location off Arkansas State Highways 387 and 24, the park is popular with residents throughout the southwest Arkansas region as well as tourists. A well-known Civil War battlefield, Poison Springs Battleground State Park, is eight miles southeast in neighboring Ouachita County. PRESCOTT SPLASH PAD

Opened in June 2018, the City of Prescott's City Park Splash Pad made its debut as a successful completion of an multi-year economic development effort. As it opened, the Splash Pad's days and hours of operation were announced as being six days a week (Mon-Sat), starting at 9 a.m. daily and closing at 9 p.m. and on Sundays from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. over the summer months.

The Splash Pad is free to the public and automated with water cycles running at ten-minute increments; at that time, a kid or parent must press a designated restart button and the water sprays again. Prescott Mayor Terry Oliver said that approximately 70-percent of the water outlets actually spray at any given time, which he says

keeps the water going, but also conserves water.

Economic Development Director Mary Godwin noted the closest similar water parks were in Arkadelphia and Texarkana, and she said "It has been a long time coming, and this fits in the category of 'Quality of Life.' When you are recruiting — or even trying to retain existing businesses — these companies want you to have a quality of life, attractions for kids and families of the employees, to have things they can do and bring their kids to."

Godwin said that a special "slip proof" concrete surface was employed to present slips and accidents. In addition to the Pad itself, additional seating and park enhancements were also made to compliment the new attraction.

PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The City of Prescott's Parks and Recreation Department has a wide variety of athletic facilities to offer families and intramural sports leagues. With softball fields, baseball fields, basketball courts, tennis courts, and a volleyball court, plenty of choices are available to the public. The Parks Department maintains the grounds continuously to provide a safe and pleasant, family-friendly atmosphere for local citizens to enjoy. This department also hosts occasional youth basketball and adult softball tournaments.

Playgrounds are available for families to enjoy at three different locations all year long, and a splash pad is open for the public in the warmer months so kids can play and cool off at the same time on those hot days. Pavilions at various locations within park grounds can be reserved for birthday parties, family reunions, and other happy gatherings. Whether one is looking for the perfect spot to have a family picnic or the best place for a quick game of hoops, Prescott's Parks and Recreation has much to offer. 




In 2022 the Nevada County Fair Association brought back a carnival that offered over 15 rides, carnival games and all of the famous carnival foods for all to enjoy.

PRAIRIE D'ANE BATTLEFIELD

Prairie D'Ane Battlefield, Elkins Ferry Battlefield and rear action at Moscow April 4-13th 1864. These battle sites became sacred ground with loss of life of American soldiers in Blue and Grey uniforms alike.

The Red River Campaign was designed by Union Forces to halt the cotton trade in Texas. General Frederick Steele was to bring Federal troops (US) south from Little Rock. His command consisted of a total of 13,000 men, 20,000 draft animals and over 800 wagons. General Nathaniel Banks would be coming from Louisiana North up the Red River and combine forces near Shreveport then head west into Texas in

the Red River Valley. By the 12th of April 1864, General Steele had reached a decision at Prairie D'Ane that he could not sustain his men and animals by foraging and had to make an alternative plan. It had been rumored that Camden

had stores (supplies) and he made the decision to head toward Camden and then try to retreat toward Little Rock, resupplied. This would later be titled "The Camden Expedition" by General Steele and other historians.

Around the 4th of April, there were only 1500 Confederates (CSA) to delay US forces from crossing the Little Missouri River at Elkins Ferry. They fought all the way back to where the Nubbin Hill Community is located today. (There is a historical marker located at Missionary Grove Baptist Church). General Sterling Price commanding the CSA troops had by then accumulated between 3500-5000 troops in the area, fearing that Federals would attack the City of Washington, (which was the Confederate Capitol for Arkansas at that time because Little Rock had been lost and occupied by the Federals). General Price,



thinking it would be the desired Federal target dug fortifications on the Prairie D'Ane and awaited General Steele's advance. Skirmishing with infantry and advancing cavalry at times including artillery battles from the 8th of April through the 12th of April. The heaviest fighting took place on the 11th and 12th of April. The federals then gave the impression of attacking by using an artillery and cavalry attack, while moving the majority of their wagons and troops on toward Camden. (There is a historical marker located in front of the TA truck stop, about the Battle of Prairie D'Ane.) On the 13th and 14th of April there were approximately 2000 fresh troops coming from the Indian territories in support of the CSA, General Price seeing that it was a diversion on the 13th ordered an attack on the US rear columns giving chase. They started engaging in the US troops close to where the Potlatch buildings now stand going through parts of Southeast Prescott toward the village of Moscow. (There is a Historical marker located at Moscow cemetery which further describes the rear action and battle that took place in the

Prairie D'Ane Battlefield will host 2 events in 2021. The first will be March 13-20, 2021 held by the Southwestern Mountain man Rendezvous and the second will be April 16-18, 2021 and will be a reenactment of the Battle of Prairie D'Ane.

Battlefield tours can be scheduled for groups by appointment.

NEVADA COUNTY DEPOT & MUSEUM



With the Cairo and Fulton Railroad being built in Nevada County in 1873, the town of Prescott was platted out in August 1873 and became the county seat in 1877. The train depot witnessed the heyday and decline of the railroads. Over a century ago, the railroad was the natural hub of activity for Prescott and Nevada County. But times changed and Prescott's 1912 train depot soon became a place that stood idle by the tracks. As passenger service ceased in about 1967, the Missouri Pacific Railroad sold the building to the city of Prescott in 1970, for one dollar.

Today the Nevada County Depot and Museum is housed in the renovated 1912 train depot. The museum is naturally situated next to the railroad tracks and lends an air of history to those who visit the museum.

The Museum has updated exhibit displays that are uncluttered and easy to view. It houses hundreds of artifacts, documents and photographs.

Among the displays are a Civil War display with troop advancement maps, period reproduction costumes, found relics from the Prairie D'Ane Battlefield and an enlarged 1864 map of Southwest Arkansas compiled by Confederate Troops. Towns and post offices are marked on the map as well as landowners. This display alone is worth a trip to the museum.

Early Prescott is represented through hundreds of photographs and local memorabilia. Schools are an important part of Nevada County's history. A school display shows early schools and the first Prescott football team.

There is a display recognizing Governor Thomas Chipman McRae, 26th Governor of Arkansas 1921-1925. Governor McRae was a long-time resident of Prescott and Nevada County. He was a family man, lawyer, banker and Politian and cared deeply about education. Stop by the Museum and find out more about this great southern gentleman. Progress is being made to develop the P & N W Railroad room with more railroad memorabilia and displays. Railroad history of Prescott is of great importance as the town was founded due to the rail being laid.

A 1920 P& NW Caboose sits on tracks located next to the Museum. The Caboose is an all-wooden caboose and was used until the 1950's. In 2016 the Caboose was taken out of storage and moved to its present location at the Museum. In 2020 it was selected by the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program to be added to the National Register of Historic Places.

Operating hours for the Museum are 9:00am-2:00pm Monday through Thursday. Admission is free but the Museum does accept donations. Appointments for groups or special circumstances are possible by contacting Heather Shelman, Museum Director at 870-887-5821. Stop by and see us. Our goal is to "Share the History". 


